

ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM—Partnering with the CCC



SB 99: Streets & Highways Code Section 2382 (f) (10) "Use of California Conservation Corps or qualified community conservation corps, as defined in Section 14507.5 of the Public Resources Code, as partners to undertake or construct applicable projects in accordance with Section 1524 of Public Law 112-141."

Benefits of Partnering with the CCC:

- Transportation projects become pathways for young adults to successfully enter the workforce
- Crews work in and are located in many disadvantaged communities
- Compliance with state law (SB 99, Chapter 359, Statutes of 2013 requires Caltrans to score projects on various criteria, including use of the CCC and Certified Local Conservation Corps)
- No point deduction on applications (0 to -5 points)
- No point deduction on future applications (up to -10 points)

What the CCC Offers:

- Supervised crews of 10-15 young adults
- Trained in safety, tool use, landscaping, irrigation and other public works skills
- Labor-intensive projects
- Contracting agencies provide some technical supervision & training

CCC Project Examples:

Sidewalk repair, removal and re-placement	Trail construction
Sign installation	Urban park construction
Irrigation	Graffiti removal
Landscaping	Bike locker & bike rack installation
Demo and deconstruction	Wildlife fencing
Tree planting	Education programs
Median Maintenance	And more . . .

ABOUT THE CALIFORNIA CONSERVATION CORPS:

The CCC is a state agency that puts together young people and the environment, to the benefit of both. Corpsmembers are young women and men between the ages of 18 and 25 who sign up for a year of education and work improving California's natural resources and communities.
