- “For restoration and ecosystem project funded by Chapter 6 of Prop 1 – the services of the California Conservation Corps or a local conservation corps certified by the CCC shall be used whenever feasible.”

California Conservation Corps &
Local Conservation Corps Locations



- Corps locations – statewide
- Conservation Corps enroll young adults to perform important conservation projects through California
- Conservation Corps are rigorous and combine: work, education, training, leadership and career development

The California Conservation Corps

- A state department within the Natural Resources Agency- founded in 1976 by Gov. Brown
- Modeled after the Civilian Conservation Corps of the 1930's
- 27 sites across the state including seven residential centers



Certified Local Conservation Corps

- 13 independent, private non-profit organizations and 1 county-run local corps
- Collectively serving ~2500 young people/year
- Certified annually by the CCC to meet strict requirements



What Can Corps Do?


- Supervised crews of 12-15 young adults
- Labor intensive projects
- Trained in safety & tool use




Ecosystem Restoration & Protection

Examples:

- Remove invasive species
- Reintroduce native species
- Plant and water trees
- Improve forest health – thin, remove slash and fire hazards
- Stabilize stream banks
- Restore fisheries
- Restore meadows
- Control erosion
- Monitor
- And other similar work...
